Celebrate the FIFA World Cup



The 2026 FIFA World Cup is coming to Southern California starting June 12. Metrolink is operating special service to make it easier for fans to get to matches and events.

They'll be adding 48 additional trains over a 10-day period across the Antelope Valley, Orange County, San Bernardino, Ventura County and 91/Perris Valley lines. This expanded service will travel to and from

Los Angeles Union Station for all eight local match days and two additional Fan Zone days.

Metrolink service will also support select fan events directly or via short connections, including the LA Memorial Coliseum (June 11–15), Pomona Fairplex (July 14–15, 18–19), and Downtown Burbank (July 18–19).

San Clemente and San Juan Capistrano.

Get to the stadium to cheer on the Dodgers without dealing with the hassle and expense of driving and parking. Baseball fans can catch a Dodger Stadium Express bus from Union Station in downtown Los Angeles or from the Harbor Gateway Transit Plaza in Gardena. Rides are free.

Catch the OC Fair Express



The OC Fair Express runs Saturdays and Sundays, July 17 to Aug. 16, dropping off riders directly at the fairgrounds in

Costa Mesa. Fares are \$2 each way, and youth 18 and under ride for free. You can purchase tickets using the OC Bus mobile app or directly when you board.

The OC Fair Express departs from locations in Anaheim, Fullerton, Huntington Beach, Irvine and the Santa Ana Regional Transportation Center. Buses run every 30 minutes.

Tap to Ride Metrolink and Arrow

Riders on Metrolink's San Bernardino Line and Arrow service will soon have an easier way to board.

A pilot program expected to launch early June will allow you to board with a simple tap of a credit or debit card, mobile wallet or wearable device. Tap at station validators before boarding and once again at your destination.

Traditional ticketing and discount options will remain.
